## Certification

Certification for medical assistants, like the Certified Medical Assistant (CMA) credential from the American Association of Medical Assistants (AAMA) or the Registered Medical Assistant (RMA) certification from American Medical Technologists (AMT), isn't always required but boosts job prospects and validates skills.
